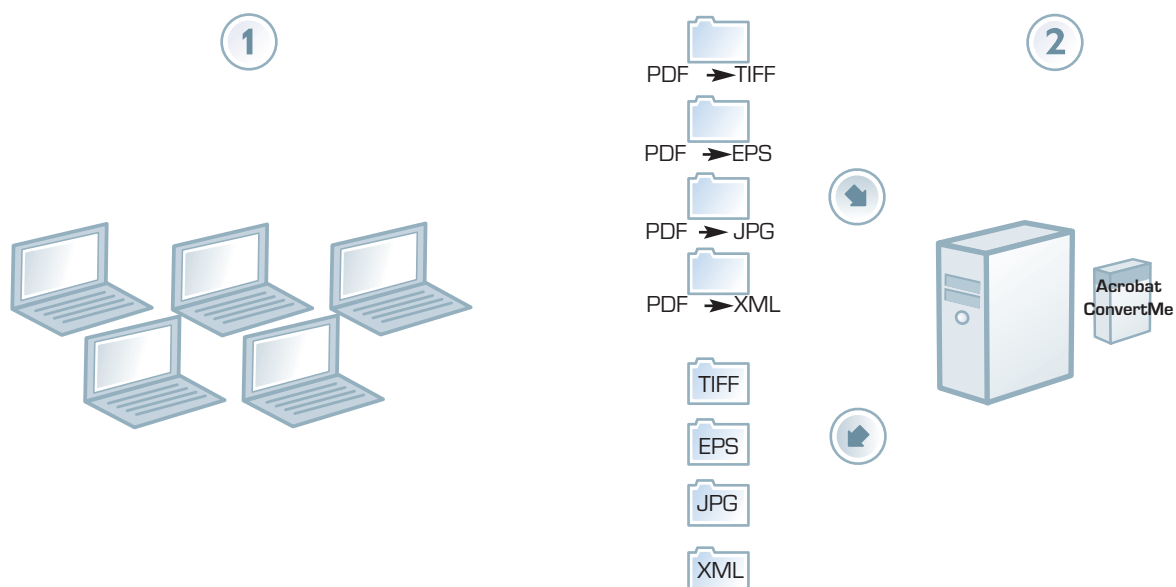


Example of a ConvertMe workflow.



1 There can be any number of users with PDF-files to convert. These PDF-files may be used for different purposes or may be included in an automated workflow. Whichever, the PDF's are going to be used for different purposes and therefore they need to be converted to a suitable file format. By dropping the PDF's into different folders, watched by ConvertMe, the files are converted to their new formats automatically.

2 There are different conversions connected to the different watched folders. When the PDF has been converted according to the settings, the new file is placed in the out folder and the user may instantly use the file. If you like to create several different file formats from the same PDF you have the option to build chains of conversions. This will generate any number of files in the different file formats requested.

There's a big advantage in using a server solution like ConvertMe to convert files. All the files will be converted according to the same rules since they are all using the same preferences. This makes the individual skills of the users less important and will give you a better standard quality of the files produced.
